George studied physics at the University of Oxford and stayed on to undertake research for which he was awarded a D.Phil in 1992. He has maintained both research and teaching interests since through active collaborations with universities in Hong Kong and Malaysia and teaching with progressive institutions including Li Po Chun United World College of Hong Kong which he joined in 1997. George left Li Po Chun to become a founding director of Teng Hoi Conservation Organization, a non-profit making NGO registered in Hong Kong in 2003.
